


ISLAM – BASIC IMPLICATIONS


- Sunni and Shia Islam
- No clear distinction between secular and sacred
- Based on Qur'an, hadith, Sunna, Shari'a
- 5 pillars
- Shahada monotheistic nature of religion
- Salat (namaz) 5 times a day prayer
- Zakat charity
- Hajj Piligrimage
- Ramadan the holy month
- Umma the Muslim community

ISLAM AS RELIGION IS BASED ON FIVE PILLARS



JIHAD

- Two kinds of jihad
- Lesser jihad jihad of sword, self-defensive war
- Bigger jihad the struggle of every Muslim with the evil inside
- Jihad is not a pillar of Islam
- Jihad is waged by a "fatwa" only by legitimate power
- Jihad is waged when Muslims are prevented to practice their religion
- Bigger jihad ascetic fight
- Jihad as the 6th pillar of Islam
- Clear distinction between political and religious leaders




OSAMA BIN LADEN

NORMS OF JIHAD

- Permission of legitimate imam
- Avoid clashes and steadfast
- Attacking in a state of unawareness is forbidden
- It is obligatory to call opponents to Islam first
- Planting mines in civil areas is prohibited
- Killing war prisoners is prohibited
- Murdering envoys prohibited
- Jihad ends with the end of the oppression of Muslims
- Neutral parties must not be harmed

14 norms

Muhammed's (PBUH) commands in Wars

Don't cut a tree



Don't kill a woman



Don't kill a child



Don't kill a sick person



Don't kill old people



Don't kill a monk or a priest



Don't destroy a temple or a church



Don't disfigure the dead



Don't destroy a building



Don't kill an animal except for eating



Don't kill those who surrendered



Be good to the prisoners and feed them



Don't kill who ran away



Don't enforce Islam

- Removing doubts about Islam
- Struggling for the umma
- Scarifying the soul and body

THE TIMES OF THE PROPHET

- Historical approach (Lawrence's theory)
- Allah and the Prophet

- Jahliyya the creation of the ummah by Muhammad

THE CONSTITUTION OF MEDINA

- How to govern the Righteousness Caliphate?
- The people of the book (the dimma) shall not be harmed
- The dimma shall have the right not to participate in the jihad
- The dimma shall enjoy the same rights as the Muslims
- The Caliphate shall be ruled by a Caliph
- Caliph?
- The Caliphate shall be governed by the Shari'a



THE RIGHTEOUSNESS CALIPHATE

- Abu Bakr vs Ali
- Jihad inside the ummah or jihad outside the ummah?
- Muslims are indivisible community
- The authority in the Caliphate is mediated through a Divine Law
- The ummah is centralized by a human authority (Khaliffa)
- Jihad became very popular after the schism between Sunni and Shia
- The Righteousness Caliphate collapsed after the dead of Muhammad's successors
- Middle Ages the age of the Caliphates

THE AGE OF THE CALIPHATES



SHAHEED

- The martyrs of Islam
- Until the creation of the Caliphate Shahids die because of their faith
- After the creation of the Caliphate Shahids die for their faith in battle
- Shahids die in jihad they are encouraged
- A Muslim can become a Shahid under certain circumstances
- Radical Islam
- Every Muslim should fulfil the Shari'a completely
- Every Muslim should fight the takfirs (Muslim who do not support radicals)
- Jihad is the new pillar of Islam
- Suicide and self-sacrifice in Islam
